DRINKING WATER PROGRAM

The Delphian School operates its' own water system. It is operated and maintained by Armen Karl (cert. date: 3 July, 2009), who is a full-time employee of the school.

This system has fewer than 300 service connections. It has a single 80,000 gallon reservoir that is fed via wells that are on the school's property. There is an air gap between the wells and the reservoir.

Treatment consists of a liquid fed chlorinator that is situated at the reservoir.

The reservoir is located approximately ¾ mile from the main facility and is situated approximately 200 feet higher in elevation.

As of December 1996 and each year subsequent, maintenance personnel determined that there are no cross-connection hazards in the facility. Additionally there are no current backflow hazards and any potential hazards are minimal. Therefore, no rules currently exist in this water district.

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In order to ensure that future cross-connection or backflow hazards are spotted and properly handled, the appropriate maintenance personnel have copies of this Ordinance and understand that it is their responsibility to be aware of the possibility of cross-connection and backflow hazards and to report them to the Water System Operator when such hazards are spotted.
