bills. Customers will be billed in advance for a two month period. Customers may elect to pay quarterly, bi-monthly, or annually for water service in advance.

SECTION 15 - TURNING ON WATER SERVICE AND METERS

No person other than an employee or representative of the District shall turn on or off any of the services or meters. Users desiring either discontinuance of service, a new service, or restoration of service shall make arrangements with the District.

SECTION 16 - INSTALLATION, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF CUSTOMER'S LINES

Customers shall install, maintain and repair all piping between meters and/or property lines and premises serviced, and shall install same at a depth sufficient to protect from damage and freezing.

All leakage occurring beyond meter installations shall be at the expense of user, and he shall be responsible for the proper maintenance and repair of lines, stop and waste valves, gate valves, pressure regulators, plumbing fixtures, hydraulic devices, etc. located within his premises.

SECTION 17 - WATER DAMAGES OR INJURIES WITHIN PROPERTY

The District shall not be liable for any damage or injury for leakage or the running of water on the premises from pipe lines, plumbing fixtures, open faucets, valves, fixtures, devices, appurtenances, and hoses beyond meters set at property lines. When a driveway is disrupted by water line installation or repair the District will replace to previous condition.

SECTION 18 - PLUMBING AND CROSS CONNECTIONS

All plumbing within buildings served by the District shall be so installed and all plumbing fixtures so constructed as to prevent pollution of water supply by back siphonage or cross connections. Water service to any premises known or found to have defects and hazards shall be disconnected and not restored until such defects and hazards have been eliminated.

Neither cross connections nor physical connections of any kind shall be made to any other water supply, whether private or public, without the written consent and approval of the State Health Division. Included in this category are all pipelines, appurtenances and facilities of the District system, and all pipes, appurtenances, pumps, tanks, storage reservoirs, facilities, equipment, appliances, etc. of other systems, whether located within or on private or public property, or the premises of a water user.

The District's superintendent or other authorized representative shall have the right to check the premises of users for physical connections with other water supplies. Any such connections shall be removed within 10 days after notice. If not removed within the time specified, District shall remove any connection which it may have for servicing the property.

SECTION 19 - MAINTENANCE, REPAIR AND TESTING OF METERS

Normal maintenance and repair of meters shall be carried on by the District at its expense. If a customer requests that his meter be tested, the District will make such tests, but should the meter so tested be found accurate within 4% of true delivery, the customer requesting such testing shall pay the cost thereof. If such meter is found to under or over register in excess of 4%, testing and repair shall be at the cost of the District.

Charges made for meter testing shall be paid in advance, and the amount shall be the deposit required for checking as set forth under rates and charges. The deposit shall be refunded if the meter is found to over or under register in excess of 4% of true flow.

Whenever a meter has been found to over register more than 4% an adjustment in reasonable amount shall be made to the customer for past billing, but in no case shall such adjustment exceed a period of one year.

SECTION 20 - PRESSURE REGULATION

The District shall make every effort to furnish water at desirable service pressure. Where service pressures are higher than needed or desired, customers shall install and maintain within their premises any pressure regulators required.

The District shall not be responsible for damages or difficulties experienced by reason of variations in pressure within the system.

SECTION 21 - MAINTENANCE AND REPLACEMENT OF MAINS

The District will maintain and replace mains within the system at its expense, provided the original installation was made by District or with materials furnished or approved by District.

SECTION 22 - WATER MAIN EXTENSIONS

The District as a whole shall pay the cost of supply, pumping stations, storage facilities and primary mains for the general distribution of water within the District, but it shall not pay the cost of main extensions to service additional customers, properties, tracts or subdivisions. Such
