CROSS CONNECTION CONTROL POLICY

A POLICY PROVIDING A CROSS CONNECTION CONTROL PROGRAM

Pursuant to Chapter 333, Division 61, of the Oregon Administrative Rules, it is the responsibility of the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association to protect its drinking water by instituting and enforcing a cross connection control program.

A cross connection control policy for the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association is hereby provided.

1:01 DEFINITIONS

- 1) "AEH & WA" means the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association or their designee.
- (2) "APPROVED BACKFLOW PREVENTION ASSEMBLY" or "BACKFLOW ASSEMBLY" or "ASSEMBLY" means an assembly to counteract backpressures or prevent backsiphonage. This assembly must appear on the list of approved assemblies issued by the Oregon State Health Division.
- (3) "BACKFLOW" means the flow in the direction opposite to the normal flow or the introduction of any foreign liquids, gases, or substances into the water system of the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association's water.

- - "CONTAMINATION" means the entry into or presence in a public water supply system of any substance which may be deleterious to health and/or quality of the water.
 - "CROSS CONNECTION" means any physical arrangement where a potable water supply (5)is connected, directly or indirectly, with any other non-drinkable water system or auxiliary system, sewer, drain conduit, swimming pool, storage reservoir, plumbing fixture, swamp coolers, or any other device which contains, or may contain, contaminated water, sewage, or other liquid of unknown or unsafe quality which may be capable of imparting contamination to the public water system as a result of backflow. Bypass arrangements, jumper connections, removable sections, swivel or changeover devices, or other temporary or permanent devices through which or because of which backflow may occur, are considered to be cross connections.
 - "DEGREE OF HAZARD" means the LOW or HIGH HAZARD classification that shall be (6)attached to all actual or potential cross connections.
 - "DOUBLE CHECK VALVE BACKFLOW PREVENTION ASSEMBLY" or "DOUBLE **(7)** CHECK ASSEMBLY" or "DOUBLE CHECK" means an assembly which consists of two (2) independently-operating check valves which are spring-loaded or weighted. The assembly comes complete with a shut-off valve on each side of the checks, as well as test cocks to test the checks for tightness.
 - "HEALTH HAZARD" means an actual or potential threat of contamination of a physical (8) or toxic nature to the public potable water system or the consumer's potable water system that would be a danger to health.
 - "HIGH HAZARD" means the classification assigned to an actual or potential cross connection that potentially could allow a substance that may cause illness or death to backflow into the potable water supply.
 - "LOW HAZARD" means the classification assigned to an actual or potential cross (10)connection that potentially could allow a substance that may be objectionable, but not hazardous to one's health, to backflow into the potable water supply.
 - "POLLUTIONAL HAZARD" means an actual or potential threat to the physical (11)properties of the water system or the potability of the public or the consumer's potable water system, but which would not constitute a health or system hazard, as defined. The maximum degree of intensity of pollution to which the potable water system could be degraded under this definition would cause a nuisance or be aesthetically objectionable or could cause minor damage to the system or its appurtenances.
 - "POTABLE WATER SUPPLY" means any system of water supply intended or used for (12)human consumption or other domestic use.

- (13) "PREMISES" or "PREMISE" means any piece of property to which water is provided, including, but not limited to, all improvements, mobile structures and structures located on it.
- (14) "PREMISE ISOLATION" means the appropriate backflow prevention at the service connection between the public water system and the water user.
- (15) "REDUCED PRESSURE PRINCIPLE BACKFLOW PREVENTION ASSEMBLY" or "REDUCED PRESSURE PRINCIPLE ASSEMBLY" or "RP ASSEMBLY" shall mean an assembly containing two independently-acting approved check valves together with a hydraulically-operated, mechanically-independent pressure differential relief valve located between the check valves, and at the same time, below the first check valve. The assembly shall include properly located test cocks and tightly closing shut-off valves at the end of the ASSEMBLY.
- (16) "RESIDENT" means a person or persons living within the territory served by the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association.
- (17) "THERMAL EXPANSION" means heated water that does not have the space to expand.

1:02 PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to protect the water supply of the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association from contamination or pollution due to any existing or potential cross connections.

1:03 CROSS CONNECTIONS REGULATED

- (1) No cross connections shall be created, installed, used or maintained within the territory served by the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association, except in accordance with this policy.
- (2) AEH & WA shall carry out or cause inspections to be carried out, and/or send out annual surveys to each resident. These surveys must be completely filled out and returned, as requested. If found necessary, an assembly commensurate with the degree of hazard will be required to be installed at the service connection.
- (3) The resident is responsible for all cross connection control within the premises.
- (4) The use of any type of chemical spray attachment connected to the premise plumbing, including garden hose fertilizers and pesticide applicators, is prohibited within the Aspen Estates

Homeowners & Water Association's water system without proper protection from the potential of backflow occurring.

(5) The use of any type of radiator flush kits attached to the premise plumbing is prohibited within the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association's water system without proper protection from backflow occurring.

1:04 BACKFLOW PREVENTION ASSEMBLY REQUIREMENTS

A backflow prevention assembly shall be required, but not limited to, in each of the following circumstances:

- (1) When the nature and extent of any activity at a premise, or the materials used in connection with any activity at a premise, or materials stored at a premise, could contaminate or pollute the potable water supply;
- (2) When a premise has one or more cross connections as that term is defined in Section 1:01, Definitions,
- (3) When internal cross connections are present that are not correctable;
- (4) When intricate plumbing arrangements are present that make it impractical to ascertain whether cross connections exist;
- (5) When a premise has a repeated history of cross connections being established or reestablished;
- (6) When materials are being used such that, if a backflow should occur, a health hazard could result;
- (7) When installation of an approved backflow prevention assembly is deemed by AEH & WA to be necessary to accomplish the purpose of these regulations;
- (8) When an appropriate cross connection survey report form has not been filed with AEH & WA;
- (9) If AEH & WA determines that additions or re-arrangements have been made to the plumbing system without the proper permits, as required by AEH & WA, premise isolation shall be required.

1:05 THERMAL EXPANSION

It is the responsibility of the property owner, and/or the lessee, to eliminate the possibility of thermal expansion, if a closed system has been created by the installation of a backflow prevention assembly

1:06 MOBILE UNITS

Any mobile unit or apparatus which uses the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association's water, or water from any PREMISE within the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association's system, shall first obtain a permit from AEH & WA.

1:07 INSTALLATION REQUIREMENTS

All backflow prevention assembly installations shall follow the requirements as stipulated by the Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) 333-061-0070 Section 8, and Section 1 through 4 of OAR 333-061-0071, or as amended.

1:08 ACCESS TO PREMISES

Authorized personnel of the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association, with proper identification and sufficient notice, shall have access during reasonable hours to all parts of a premise and within the structure to which water is supplied. However, if any resident refuses authorized personnel access to a premise, or to the interior of a structure, during these hours for inspection, a reduced pressure principle assembly must be installed at the service connection to that premise.

1:09 ANNUAL TESTING AND REPAIRS

All backflow prevention assemblies installed within the territory served by the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association shall be tested immediately upon installation, and at least annually thereafter by a state certified tester. Upon completion of the installation of any assemblies within the premises, AEH & WA shall be notified. All backflow assemblies must be registered with AEH & WA. Registration shall consist of the date of installation, make, model, size, serial number, location, and initial test report. Any such assemblies found not functioning properly shall be promptly repaired or replaced at the expense of the resident. If any such assembly is not promptly repaired or replaced, AEH & WA may deny or discontinue water to the premise.

1:10 COSTS OF COMPLIANCE

All costs associated with purchase, installation, inspections, testing, replacement, maintenance, parts, and repairs of the backflow prevention assembly are the financial responsibility of the property owner. AEH & WA will annually contract with a certified tester to test the backflow assemblies. The cost will be included in the property owner's water bill. Failure to pay costs will result in discontinuance of water service to the premises.

1:11 TERMINATION OF SERVICE

Failure on the part of any customer to discontinue the use of all cross connections and to physically separate cross connections is sufficient cause for the immediate discontinuance of public water service to the premises. (OAR chapter 333-61-070, section 1b, or as amended).

1:12 CONSTITUTIONALITY AND SAVING CLAUSE

That if any provision, section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Policy, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances, are for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or for any reason unenforceable, the validity of the remaining portions of this Policy, or its application to other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected; thereby, it being the intent of the Aspen Estates Homeowners & Water Association in adopting and approving this Policy that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any other portion, provision, or regulation.

1:13 EFFECTIVE DATE

This Policy shall be effective as of March 9, 2000.
