RE: Extension to the Bilateral Compliance Agreement between the Oregon Health Authority and the City of Nyssa, PWS OR4100579

The City of Nyssa (the City) entered into a bilateral compliance agreement (BCA) with the Oregon Health Authority, Public Health Division, Center for Health Protection, Drinking Water Services (DWS) on May 29, 2013.


The aforementioned agreement set forth actions to be completed by the City to construct and install an approved treatment system to reduce arsenic in drinking water produced by the Nyssa water system to concentrations below the MCL as specified in OAR 333-061-0030(1). The City is moving forward with design plans and project specifications. However, the City will be unable to submit construction plans as agreed to in the May 29, 2013 BCA due to delays beyond the City's control.

Based on the City's progress to satisfy the terms of the BCA signed on May 29, 2013, DWS agrees to an extension of Agreement Activity No. 2 in that agreement as specified below.

TERMS OF THE EXTENSION


- The City will submit complete construction plans to DWS identifying how the City will ensure compliance with the MCL for arsenic at the Nyssa water system no later than July 1, 2015.
- DWS and the City agree that this extension applies only to the specific compliance actions identified above, and does not constitute a waiver, modification, or suspension of any other agreement activity, requirement, or term specified in the BCA signed by DWS on May 29, 2013, which remains in full force and effect.
