RE: Failure to comply with administrative order and possible civil penalties.

On February 28, 2023, The Oregon Health Authority, Public Health Division, Center for Health Protection, Drinking Water Services (DWS) issued a notice of violation and administrative order (Order) to Evergreen Acres Water Service (hereinafter “Water Supplier”) due to violations at the public water system (hereinafter “Water System”), identified by PWS ID# OR4100805 and serving residences located between Highway 103 and the Nehalem River in Vinemaple, Oregon.

Specifically, the Order required Water Supplier to report monitoring for coliform bacteria every month. Three months have passed without completion of the required action and without Water Supplier demonstrating progress toward completing the action.

Water Supplier is now at risk of being assessed civil penalties in the amount of \$50 for every distinct rule violation and for every day the Water System is in violation of a rule (OAR 333-061-0090).

In the event Drinking Water services assesses a civil penalty against Water Supplier, you will be notified in writing and provided an opportunity for a hearing pursuant to the Oregon Administrative Procedures Act (ORS chapter 183).

To avoid being assessed civil penalties, Water Supplier must immediately report monitoring for coliform bacteria and verify completing this action by sending an email to [bradley.k.daniels@dhsoha.state.or.us](mailto:bradley.k.daniels@dhsoha.state.or.us).
