RE: Failure to comply with Notice of Violation and Administrative Order and possible civil penalties.

On June 1, 2021, the Oregon Health Authority, Public Health Division, Center for Health Protection, Drinking Water Services (DWS) issued an administrative order (Order) to Henrietta Knott (hereinafter “Water Supplier”) due to violations at the Bolder City public water system (hereinafter “Water System”), identified by PWS ID# OR4101154 and located at 11425 Upper Applegate Road in Jackson County, Oregon.

Specifically, the Order required Water Supplier to monitor coliform bacteria, *E. coli* in source water, disinfection byproducts and nitrate at the Water System. The date for nitrate monitoring has passed without completion of the required action and without Water Supplier demonstrating progress toward completing the action.

Water Supplier is now at risk of being assessed civil penalties in the amount of \$50 for every distinct rule violation and for every day the Water System is in violation of a rule (OAR 333-061-0090).

In the event Drinking Water services assesses a civil penalty against Water Supplier, you will be notified in writing and provided an opportunity for a hearing pursuant to the Oregon Administrative Procedures Act (ORS chapter 183).

To avoid being assessed civil penalties, Water Supplier must immediately monitor for nitrate at the Water System and report the sample results to DWS.
