RE: Notice of failure to correct significant deficiencies at the Smith River Marina & RV Park public water system

Fang-Chung Lee, records indicate you own and operate the public water system serving the Smith River Marina & RV Park (hereinafter "Water System"), identified by public water system ID# OR4192133 and located at 8451 Lower Smith River Road, northeast of Reedsport, Oregon. Fang-Chung Lee (hereinafter "Water Supplier"), you are therefore a water supplier as defined in ORS 448.115(12) and OAR 333-061-0020(150) and have specific responsibilities as defined in OAR 333-061-0025.

The Water System is subject to regulation according to the Oregon Drinking Water Quality Act (Oregon Revised Statutes 448.115 to 448.290) and Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 333-061-0005 through OAR 333-061-0272.

OAR 333-061-0076(5) requires water suppliers to correct significant deficiencies or to comply with an approved corrective action schedule. The Oregon Health Authority, Drinking Water Services (DWS) reviewed the operation of the Water System and found that two significant deficiencies were identified during a sanitary survey conducted on January 20, 2022. Water Supplier has not reported that these deficiencies were corrected by the August 18, 2022 due date. Water Supplier is therefore not in compliance with OAR 333-061-0076(5) and not meeting its responsibilities as a water supplier.

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These deficiencies, the lack of a screened vent for a finished water storage facility and the lack of a watertight casing and sanitary seal for a groundwater well, are both considered a direct pathway for contamination to enter a water system and are priorities for correction.

Please submit written verification to me that these deficiencies were corrected within 30 days of the date of this notice.

If Water Supplier does not comply with the deadline specified in this letter, the continued non-compliance may result in additional enforcement action, which could include the assessment of civil penalties in the amount of \$50 for every distinct rule violation and for every day the Water System is in violation of a rule as prescribed by OAR 333-061-0090.
