RE: Failure to comply with administrative order and possible civil penalties.

On June 21, 2024, The Oregon Health Authority, Public Health Division, Center for Health Protection, Drinking Water Services (DWS) issued a notice of violation and administrative order (Order) to you, Cody Ott, (hereinafter "Water Supplier") due to violations at the Lakeview Grocery public water system (hereinafter "Water System"), identified by PWS ID# OR4195160 and located at 19385 Highway 36 in Blachly, Oregon.

Specifically, the Order required monitoring for coliform bacteria to be reported for six consecutive months; however, Water Supplier only reported monitoring for coliform bacteria for one month and failed to report coliform monitoring for the two most recent consecutive months.

Water Supplier is now at risk of being assessed civil penalties in the amount of \$50 for every distinct rule violation and for every day the Water System is in violation of a rule (OAR 333-061-0090).

In the event Drinking Water services assesses a civil penalty against Water Supplier, you will be notified in writing and provided an opportunity for a hearing pursuant to the Oregon Administrative Procedures Act (ORS chapter 183).

To avoid being assessed civil penalties, Water Supplier must immediately report both nitrate monitoring and resume reporting coliform monitoring every month and verify completing this action by sending an email to bradley.k.daniels@oha.oregon.gov.
