TECHNICAL SERVICES
DRINKING WATER PROGRAM

The purpose of this ordinance in conjunction with the Uniform Plumbing Code Chapter 10, State of Oregon cross connection regulations and the current edition of the Cross Connection Control Manual Accepted Procedure and Practice, published by the Pacific Northwest Section, American Water Works Association, is to protect the health of the water consumer and the portability of the water in the distribution system. Inspection and regulation of all actual or potential cross connections between port and non-portable systems is required in order to minimize the danger of contamination or pollution of public potable water supply. Controlling and preventing cross connections is accomplished by either removing the cross connection or installing an approved backflow prevention assembly to protect the public potable water supply.

The Caveman Mobile Park is required to eliminate or control all cross connections throughout its service area. Therefore, anyone wanting or using water from the Caveman Mobil Park required to comply with these regulations. The owner of the property in which a cross connection occurs is fully responsible for all damaged incurred.

The owner or manager will enforce the provisions of this ordinance. The owner may delegate responsibilities to a Certified cross Connection Control Specialist/Inspector. The provisions of this ordinance may supersede state regulations but in no case shall they be less stringent. All approved standards shall be approved by the Caveman Mobil Park and the owner or manager. All backflow prevention assemblies required by this ordinance shall be a model approved by the Oregon Health Division DWP.

Approved backflow prevention assemblies required by this ordinance shall be installed under the direction of the owner or manager, and/or under the supervision of the Cross-Connection Specialist/Inspector per Caveman Mobil Park standards.

All RPBAs, RPDAs, DCVAs. DCDAs and PVBAs are required to be tested at least annually. Completed test reports shall be returned to Caveman Mobil Park within 30 days after receipt of the yearly test notification. Tests and inspections may be required on a more frequent basis at the discretion of the owner.

Authorized employees of Caveman Mobil Park with proper identification shall have free access at reasonable hours of the day to all parts of a premises or within buildings to which water is supplied. Water service shall be refused or terminated to any premises for failure to allow necessary inspections.

Failure to the customer to cooperate in the installation, maintenance, repair, inspection or testing of backflow prevention assemblies required by this ordinance shall be grounds for termination of water service to the premises or the requirement for an air gap separation.

TENANT EDUCTION AND INFORMATION

Caveman Mobil Park will adopt and carry out an ongoing education program for its tenants and premise owners about the general hazards involved with cross connections to the community water system. The program will consist of periodic newsletters, questionnaires to tenants about the existence of a variety of cross connections, informational meetings and cross connection control information sheets provided to each new tenant. All tenants will be advised of the requirements to notify Caveman Mobil Park management of any water treatment devices installed on home plumbing or of any chemicals they inject into the potable water supply.

Pursuant to Chapter 333, Division 61 of the Oregon Administrative Rules it is the responsibility of Caveman Mobil Park to protect its drinking water by instituting and enforcing a "cross-connection control program".

The purpose of the State "cross-connection control program" is to mandate P. R. Nicholson Property as the owners of Caveman Mobil Park to set certain rules to which you must abide to maximize your protection against potentially harmful cross-connection within the park. We pass out to you at movein and then once a year thereafter as to what a "cross-connections.

The State requires as the first step in an effective program, that we have a document establishing authority. Hence, Caveman Mobil Park as sole owners of the water distribution system and the land on which it traverses give ourselves that authority.

As a mobile home park, opposed to a manufacturing facility, agriculture enterprises, chemical processing, metal plating facility or etc. we do not have any really potentially hazardous cross-connections which might commonly occur. However, each of you has an outdoor faucet to which you connect your garden hose, there are many documented deaths caused by bringing garden hoses, and hence out drinking water, into contact with poisonous substances. Please give some thought when attaching anything to our drinking water system which might be hazardous to you and your neighbors health. Should we or park management see or hear of any cross-connection or potential for it, you will be immediately advised and take it upon yourself to immediately correct the problem to our satisfaction at your cost or face an immediate shut off of your water supply by ourselves. Additionally, any installation of an appliance (dishwasher, hot-tub, irrigation system, solar water preheating system, and etc.) connected to our fresh drinking water supply shall conform to all local and State plumbing codes.

We have owned the Park for (12) twelve years with no know cross-connections resulting in the health mishap and is not likely to have any in the future, but the clean and pure drinking water which we take for granted can be contaminated causing illness or death. Please give thought to what you connect to our water system and if in doubt about the allowability or safety of it please check with management.

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
