CROSS CONNECTION POLICY

This Cross Connection Policy is written and implemented under the requirements of the State Of Oregon regarding community water systems. All community water systems must have a policy in order to protect drinking water from being contaminated by sprinkler, irrigation, or other pipe connections which may come in contact with the pipes for the drinking water supply.

If the owner or managing agent of Leisure Pines Mobile Ranch has reasonable cause to believe that an existing or potential cross connection is located on a user's premises and does not have the proper backflow prevention device, the water supplier (Leisure Pines) shall deny or discontinue service to those premises until an appropriate backflow assembly device is installed or until the cause of the hazard is eliminated.

Leisure Pines follows the procedures and practices recommeded by the Pacific Northwest Section, American Water Works Association. A copy of their manual is available for reference at the office of Commercial Property Management (773-6400) Leslie Hall is the contact person for questions on cross connection rules or procedures.

There are currently four cross connections at Leisure Pines, which are controlled by Atmospheric Vaccuum Breakers approved by the Health Division. They are inspected periodically by a certified inspector. A yearly report is filed with the Oregon State Health Division on the current cross connections and whether any hazards were found. We have found no hazards in the current backflow prevention devices.

All park residents must allow their premises to be inspected for cross connection violations by a certified inspector hired by the park owner. All lawn sprinkler systems are required to have a backflow assembly approved by the Oregon State Health Division. Any new sprinkler system installation must be approved by the park owner or his agent and must have the required devices. You may be required to install a backflow assembly device on a service or other cross connection to drinking water supply at your own space.

You may contact the park management or the Oregon Health Division, Drinking Water Program (503) 731-4899, for information on approved devices and a list of certified inspectors.
