Thank you for your submittal to the Oregon Health Authority's Drinking Water Services (DWS) of plan review information for the Imperial River Company waterline project in the City of Maupin. On August 21, 2024, our office received items plans and a plan review fee of \$3,300.

The project includes installation of about 620 feet of 8" C900 PVC and associated appurtenances.

The plans are approved with the following conditions:

- All items in contact with potable water must meet NSF Standard 61 or equivalent.
- The design must allow for 20 psi to be maintained at all service meters.
- Disinfection of the waterline must be completed according to AWWA C651. Results from the coliform sampling must be provided to our office.

Until we receive verification that the conditions have been met and final approval has been issued, the facility is not approved for use. Upon completion of the project, the engineer must verify in writing that construction was completed according to the submitted plans. If substantial changes are made, a set of as-built drawings must be submitted.
