RE: Compliance Schedule for Violations at the Brewster Community Homeowners public water system

Dear Mr. Anguiano,

This letter is a follow-up to a letter sent to you on 6/3/2016. I have been unable to contact you by phone and your voice message box is full. The water system has not reported a routine total coliform sample since May 2016. Additional required repeat/source samples and public notices have not been reported either resulting in unresolved violations. When a public water system has unresolved violations for more than 5 months, these violations must then be resolved within 90 days or the water system will be referred for formal enforcement.

Brewster Community Homeowners water system has the following violations that must be resolved within 90 days:

Violation #1: OAR 333-061-0036(6) Routine Coliform – Did not report any – June 2016

Violation #2: OAR 333-061-0036(6) Repeat Coliform – Did not report any – January 2016

Violation #3 & #4: OAR 333-061-0036(6) GWR Source Sample – Did not report any – January 2016, May-June 2016

Violation #5 & #6: OAR 333-061-0042 Public Notice – Did not provide – February 2015, January 2016

Violation #7: OAR 333-061-0025(12) No certified operator to supervise and to be in direct responsible charge of the water system



In order to return to compliance, you must resolve the above violations according to the following compliance schedule:

- 1) The water system must monitor for routine total coliform every month. The results for the August 2016 sample must be reported to the State by September 10, 2016.
- 2) A source sample, collected at the well head and analyzed for total coliform/E. coli needs to be collected in August 2016 and reported to the State by September 10, 2016. Make sure the sample is labeled source assessment.
- 3) A public notice for failure to collect repeat coliform samples needs to be issued and a copy provided to me by September 30, 2016. A public notice template is provided for you to use.
- 4) A Level 1 Coliform Investigation needs to be completed and returned to me by September 30, 2016 (form attached).
- 5) A certified operator and person in direct responsible charge (DRC) needs to be designated for this water system by October 31, 2016.

Failure to comply with the above compliance schedule may result in formal enforcement action which could include the assessment of civil penalties. If you have any questions or concerns, please call me at (503) 588-5407.
