RE: Violation of Settlement Agreement, Deer Island Heights Water System,
OR4105114

Deer Island Heights is a public water system subject to the requirements of Oregon Revised Statutes, Chapter 448, and Oregon Administrative Rules 333-061-0005 through 333-061-0295.

You signed a Settlement Agreement on February 17, 2009 agreeing that Deer Island Heights would collect monthly coliform bacteria samples beginning in January 2009. You also agreed to submit sample results for synthetic organic chemicals no later than April 10, 2009. The Agreement stipulated that failure by Deer Island Heights to meet any of the articles agreed upon would result in the restoration of \$3,450 in civil penalties originally assessed on November 19, 2008.

As of May 20, 2009 the Oregon Department of Human Services, Public Health Division, Office of Environmental Public Health, Drinking Water Program (Agency) has not received coliform bacteria sample results for the month of April, or sample results for synthetic organic chemicals, as specified above. The civil penalty in the amount of \$3,450 is now due no later than 10 days after service date of this notice.

Please remit a check in the amount of \$3,450 for the civil penalty to: DHS - Drinking Water Program. Mail the check to DHS - Drinking Water Program, PO Box 14450, Portland, OR 97293-0450.



If payment in full is not received within 11 days of the date of this letter, the Agency will assign the civil penalty to the Department of Revenue for collection. Reasonable administrative costs, collection costs, attorney's fees, and all other costs and charges necessary for the collection of any amount not paid when due, including but not limited to collection charges assessed by the Department of Revenue may be added to the amount due of \$3,450.
